The following are some ideas in helping those individuals who think or know they are being followed.

The most important factor is not to panic and don't drive recklessly. Pay attention what is in front of you and behind you. The person behind, might have someone in front waiting for you to make a wrong decision.

First off, be aware of your surroundings. Whenever possible, walk in groups to your car. If you suspect you're being followed out from work, go back in and ask for security or call police for an escort to car.

While driving car on city streets, make several right hand turns. A few cars behind you might have to go the same direction a few right hand turns. A fourth right hand turn and someone is still following you, they are likely following you.

Highway driving. Use ramp to get off and then get right back on. Slow down and use right lane. Drive speed limit or slightly slower. If you still think that you may be being followed, call 911.

Never ever pull into drive or parking lot of your residence.

Learn where convenient Police stations are on your way home. If you drive west on I-90, familiarize yourself with the Lakewood police station. I-90 eastbound, use Euclid PD. There are 2 Cleveland Police Stations off of I-71, Fulton Road and again at West 130th street. I-271 Southbound use Mayfield PD. I-77 south use Newburg Heights PD. Learn where these stations are before there is an emergency.

With all these situations, dial 911 and tell police where you are, direction you are heading, description of your car. While talking to dispatcher, another car will approach both cars with assistance for you.

Always, always if you think you are being followed, use common sense, use your phone to contact police or always ask for escort.
